# Pending Unemployment Insurance Claim Payment Grants, Office of the Comptroller and Department of Labor

\$32.0 Million (E00A04.01)

#### **Purpose: Recovery Now Funding**

The Comptroller's Revenue Administration Division shall provide a \$1,000 grant to any individual whose claim for unemployment benefits is pending a determination of eligibility and has been in adjudication for at least 30 days, except for a claim where the failure to determine eligibility is related to an allegation of fraud. The Secretary of Labor shall send a list of individuals eligible for a grant, along with any information necessary to distribute the grants, by March 3, 2021 (as of February 28, 2021); April 5, 2021 (as of March 31, 2021); May 5, 2021 (as of April 30, 2021); June 3, 2021 (as of May 31, 2021); and July 6, 2021 (as of June 30, 2021). An individual may not receive more than one grant under this provision.

## June 16 - Program Highlights and Plans to Allocate Remaining Balance:

- On June 4, 2021, Labor provided the Comptroller's office with a list of 3,316 claimants (through May 28, 2021), for a distribution of \$3,316,000, an increase of 10.9 percent over the April cumulative distribution. In total, distributions total \$33,848,000, for 33,848 total claimants.
- The department has also posted a message to its website explaining the grant to the public, along with an accompanying link for more information about the RELIEF Act.
- Supplemental Budget #5 included an additional \$8 million in federal funding to support this program, above the original Recovery Now allocation of \$32 million.
- June's payment will be reported at the beginning of July.

## **June 16 - Programmatic and/or Implementation Issues:**

• Labor is unable to administer this grant program because our UI Division is federally funded. We are unable to utilize these federal grant resources to administer a state grant program.
