SUMMARY

The Board of Public Works ensures that State expenditures are necessary, appropriate, fair, and lawful. To this end, the Board, which consists of the Governor, Comptroller, and Treasurer, approves State contracts. The Board also authorizes capital improvements for State government offices, District Court facilities, and several statewide programs including asbestos abatement, major maintenance projects known as facilities renewal projects, replacement of chillers which use chlorofluorocarbons (CFC), replacement of all state-owned underground heating oil storage tanks, and accessibility improvements for individuals with disabilities at all State buildings. These programs and facilities are generally managed by the Department of General Services.

Between FY 1996 and FY 2004 statewide programs were funded as follows:

- \$13,500,000 was provided for accessibility improvements at State buildings
- \$14,542,000 was provided for asbestos abatement
- \$22,128,000 was provided for CFC mitigation projects
- \$91,903,000 was provided for facilities renewal projects
- \$10,050,000 was provided for underground storage tank removal and replacement
- \$27,800,000 was provided for construction of a statewide High Speed Data Network
- \$16,151,000 was provided for the upgrade of the statewide Public Safety Communications System.

In addition to continued funding for statewide programs, the five-year capital improvement program includes funding for improvements to State office facilities in Annapolis and Baltimore City, and new District Court facilities in Allegany and Montgomery Counties. These projects will increase public access to government buildings and judicial proceedings.

CHANGES TO FY 2004 - FY 2008 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Changes to FY 2005

Additions:

State House Renovations (C): Funds to renovate building systems in the State House in Annapolis were added in FY 2005 to improve the function and efficiency of the building.

Construction Contingency Fund (C): Funds to supplement the Construction Contingency Fund were added in FY 2005 to meet unanticipated construction expenses through FY 2005.

Centreville District Court Expansion (P): Funds to prepare plans for the expansion of the Centreville District Court in Queen Anne's County were added to FY 2005 because space in the local multiservice center will become available when the current occupant relocates to new offices in April 2004.

Deletions:

Cumberland District Court (A): Funds for property acquisition for the District Court in Cumberland were deferred until FY 2007 to accommodate other budget priorities.

High Speed Data Network (CE): Funds for construction and equipping of the High Speed Data Network were deferred until FY 2006 and the project cost reduced to reflect revised technical requirements.

Changes to FY 2006 - FY 2008

Funds for the Chlorofluorocarbon (CFC) Mitigation program were deleted because the program will be complete after FY 2005.

Funds to purchase capital equipment for the Lowe House Office Building were added to FY 2006 based on a revised equipment list.

Upgrade and renovate the interior of the State House in Annapolis. The project consists of the replacement of the chilled water piping system, the steam line to the hot water converter, the heating water distribution system and the condensate drain system. Additional work includes the replacement of reheating coils and controls, existing cooling and heating coils, modifications to air handling units, upgrades to the electrical system, and restoring all interior finishes to their original appearance.

The buildings are in need of modernization and are overcrowded with inadequate space for hearings and public functions. FY 2006 funds will be used to purchase capital equipment for the addition to the Lowe House Office Building.
