SOUTHERN MARYLAND HIGHER EDUCATION CENTER

SUMMARY

The Southern Maryland Higher Education Center was established in 1994 to provide continuing education courses to citizens in St. Mary's, Charles and Calvert Counties. The Center's mission is to provide quality graduate and upper level undergraduate education to citizens of Southern Maryland; to promote a climate of cooperation between universities, government and business; to advance Southern Maryland as a technologically-advanced area; to help create high technology jobs; and to facilitate the economic development of the three counties in Southern Maryland. Currently, eight universities teach courses at the Center including the Johns Hopkins University, George Washington University, Towson University, and University of Maryland, Baltimore County. Tuition rates are set by each institution. Approximately 60 percent of the students are from St. Mary's County, 25 percent are from Calvert County, and 15 percent are from Charles County.

The demand for education and training opportunities in Southern Maryland is growing rapidly. In fall 1995, the Center offered only two courses and in fall 2003, the Center offered 73 courses. The Center anticipates continued enrollment growth due to the relocation of U.S. military personnel to the Patuxent River Naval Air Station in St. Mary's County. In order to accommodate the projected increase in enrollment, the five-year capital improvement program includes planning funds for a third classroom building on its campus.
