SUMMARY

The Maryland Department of Disabilities, formerly the Governor's Office for Individuals with Disabilities, was created in response to the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA). These acts require that all programs, activities, services and employment opportunities offered to the general public, also be accessible to individuals with disabilities. The establishment of a program entitled Access Maryland addressed this requirement. This program provides for accessibility modifications to eliminate architectural barriers in State-owned facilities. Accessibility modifications may include signage, visual fire alarms, chairlifts, elevators, ramps, curb cuts, automatic door openers, and handicapped restrooms including fixtures and accessories.
